The 2008 Clan Farquharson UK Gathering

The 2008 Clan Farquharson UK Gathering has different timing this year.

Instead of the usual weekend event the gathering runs from Tuesday to Friday from August 12 to 15 in Ballater.

On **Thursday August 14** there is another chance to enjoy a traditional Scottish past time with the Highland Games Ceilidh at the Albert Hall. This is not arranged by the Clan but is very good fun.

On **Friday August 15** the Clan Farquharson AGM takes place at the Glen Lui Hotel, Ballater.

This is followed by a visit to the Clan Farquharson Cairn and a visit to Braemar Castle.
